LETTER FROM PASTOR COLETON



I made two promises to God right before I entered high school. One was that I would begin going to church when I was able to drive. The second was that I was going to do whatever I wanted to do with my life until the end of high school. I wanted to experience all the high school had to offer and I knew God would get in the way of that.

I made good on the first promise. I went to church right after I turned 16. It was terrible. It was boring. I felt suspiciously as if they were trying to make it boring on purpose. The Sunday school teacher was not dynamic in any way. He wore thick glasses, spoke slowly and monotone, and read his notes like he was reading his own obituary. He taught some verse in Romans about how Jesus dies for bad people. He said we would never die for bad people, Jesus is the only one who has ever done that. I wasn't planning on dying for anyone, so I really didn't care. I left the church that day feeling good about myself. I kept my promise and now I could go back to my life.

Fast-forward one year. I was a junior in high school. I threw a party at my house. My friends and I finished the beer we were able to score with a fake ID and then proceeded to raid my Dad's liquor cabinet. We drank til we couldn't stand. I don't remember most of that night but one moment is crystallized in my mind. A friend of mine was going on and on about how he would die for this girl he loved. He wouldn't stop talking about it. And in that moment, as I was dry-heaving into a trashcan, the Romans message, from the year before, came back to me. The words, "some might die for the righteous but God shows His love for us that while we were still sinners, Christ died for the ungodly." I didn't know at the time that these words were Romans 5:8. I had never quoted scripture before, but I could not get those words our of my head. They just kept repeating over and over in my head hammering on my heart.

The next morning I woke up hungover and broken over what I had made of my life. I felt in that moment that God was, for some reason, pursuing me. Not to condemn me, but to set me free. He was pursuing me with love instead of wrath. I was at my worst and that was the moment He came to find me. That morning was the day I surrendered my life to Jesus.

My story is a story of God's faithfulness. It wasn't a dynamic communicator or church environment that changed my life. God was just faithful to His promise that His word does not return void. And so, it is with that hope that we lead this student ministry. We definitely want engaging teaching and an environment students love, but more than anything we want to rest and trust in the power of God to transform lives. We believe the Gospel of Jesus is the power of God for salvation not the communicator or the environment. Our trust rests in Jesus to build His church, Jesus to set sinners free, and Jesus to draw students to Himself through the power of the Spirit.
